### **Poster Guidelines**

Posters should be:

- brief and clearly organized;
- simple, with an obvious theme; and
- easy to read from 4 to 6 feet away.
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### **Poster Dimensions**

- All posters must fit into a 36" x 48" space.
- Tape and tacks will be provided.
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### **Poster Set up and Removal**

- Set up on Tuesday, September 15 between 7:30 and 10:00 a.m.
- Remove by Thursday, September 17 at 12:00 p.m.

### **Notification of Acceptance**

The Organizational Leadership Department at Purdue University will be responsible for having submissions blind reviewed. We will notify you regarding acceptance by e-mail no later than **June 1, 2009**. We will provide reviews on any submitted proposal.

Authors will be expected to pay for their own travel expenses and the conference fee which is minimal.

Submitting a paper represents a commitment that at least one of the authors will attend and participate in whatever session the paper gets scheduled for, whenever during the conference that session is scheduled, and whichever format that session is. Papers may be accepted either for a regular paper-presentation session format or for a research-development workshop round-table-discussion format (which requires authors to provide feedback to each other on their papers). Authors who commit to attend and participate but then fail to do so, for any reason other than an immediate genuine emergency, may be

excluded from participation in future meetings.

Papers must be submitted in PDF format. Note that Microsoft Word documents can be converted to PDF format for FREE (with no software required) by using one of the six on-line file-conversion web sites – see the submission web page above for links and details.

- Presenters are required to register for the conference.
- Prepare and duplicate handouts for your session. Handouts are to be 3-hole punched for inclusion in conference binder for attendees. Please bring 50 copies.
- Notify the Center education team immediately of any changes in presenters
